FIRST AID IMPORTANT PART OF RAILWAY WORK

Montreal, N. B. - The operation of a great railway system entails various activities which, on the face of it, would not appear to bear direct connection with railway operation. They, however, are considered to be in the best interests of efficiency and safety and one of these, in particular, is the work of instructing employees in the principles of First Aid carried on by means of classes.

The work of First Aid is carried on under the auspices of the Saint John Ambulance Association, a branch of the order of Knights Hospitalliers of Saint John of Jerusalem headquarters of which are in London, England.

Throughout the Canadian National System, classes are held where they are taught to properly take care of injuries and render such necessary First Aid as will prevent further injury and possibly save life until the arrival of a medical man.

The work on the Atlantic Region of the Canadian National System is carried on under a Regional Organizer of First Aid, F. W. Freeman.
