



Russian offensive in Turkish Armenia In the district west and southwest of Trebizond is being successfully push-ed, the war office announced today. The Turks are being forced back in the direction of the Karshut river, which runs through Ardasa, about 40 miles southwest of Trebizond, and empties into the Black Sea near Tre-voll, fifty miles west from Trebizond. The official statement reads: "Caucasus front: In the coastal front our troops continue toward the river Karashut-Darasi and have captured a number of prisoners."





"It is understood that Ambassador James W. Gerard, who is on his way over here will lay the Kaiser's request before President Wilson within a


