His father was the general who, in 1866, led the Italian advance on the Isonzo, which was cut short by diplomatic interference, and the subsequent sranting of Italian lands to Austria beyond the Isonzo and the Adriatic. The present general was born in the army, and is said to know the northern frontier of Italy as one knows the palm of his hand.
