Yesterday's Results In the Big Leagues

New York, Sept. 17.—Cleveland increased its lead in the American League pennant race to one full game today by winning from Washington, while Chicago was winning the second game of the series from New York. Brooklyn maintained its six game lead in the National League race by defeating Cincinnati, the champions, who slipped to third place as a result of the New York Giants' victory over Pittsburgh.

Cleveland has a lead of 14 points in the American League, the first three clubs are so closely bunched as regards games won and lost that one day's results has little effect upon the chances of any of the three winning the pennant. Cleveland had its slump and then followed a string of defeats for Chicago, but the Yankees have not yet clinched the pennant. It is a mathematical impossibility to figure out a certain winner. The Yankees, however, are different, and although Brooklyn has not yet clinched the pennant it will take almost a superhuman effort to nose them out. The Yankees have ten more games to play, and if they win seven it would be impossible for New York or Cincinnati to tie them if the Giants and Reds won all their remaining games.
