to make in favor of its consummation. We affirm ourselves in favor of the Union of Canadian Methodism, whenever it can be accomplished without doing violence to our cherished distinctive principles.

2. "Any basis of Union to be acceptable to this Conference, must secure to the laity their full share of right in the government of the Church.

3. "That while, in view of our connection with the Bible Christian Conference in England, we cannot take any measure for annalgamation with any other body or bodies without the consent of the English Conference, nevertheless we hereby empower the Executive Committee during the present year to act as to them may seem right, provided always that they do not commit us to any scheme repugnant to the above resolutions.

4. "That the Secretary be instructed to send a copy of the above resolutions to the Presidents of the several Methodist Churches in Canada.

5. "That the Corresponding Secretary with England, be requested to communicate with the English Conference authorities, with the view of eliciting their views on this question."
