

FIELD, JOHN COLLARD. (*West Northumberland.*)

B. in Wiveliscombe, Somersetshire, Eng. Descended from John and Martha Field, of the same place. Ed. partly in England and at the Grammar School, Cobourg. M. in the Tp. of Hamilton 15 May 1844. Miss Thirsa Pearse. Was a Town Councillor of Cobourg for two years. First returned to Parl. at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Cobourg, Ont.*

FRASER, Hon. CHRISTOPHER FINLAY, Q. C. (*Brockville.*)

S. of Mr. J. S. Fraser, of Brockville, Ont. B. there, 1838. M. Miss Lafayette, of the same town. Studied law with the Hon. A. N. Richards, Q.C., and was called to the Bar, U.C., in Trinity Term 1865. Is Presdt. of the Catholic Literary Assn., of Brockville. Was one of the originators of the Ont. Catholic League. Apptd. a mem. of the Ex. Council, 25 Nov. 1873, and was Provl.-Secy. and Registrar from that date until 4 April 1864, when appointed Commissioner of Public Works, (*Salary, \$4,500.*) An unsuccessful candidate for Brockville in present House, at g.e. 1867, and for South Grenville at g.e. 1871. First returned, for South Grenville, March 1872, on death of sitting mem., but unseated on petition. Again returned on new election, Oct. 1872, and by acclamation, on his appt. to office; re-elected at g.e. 1875. Was elected for Brockville at last g.e., being defeated in South Grenville, where he was also a candidate. Created a Q.C., 1876. A Liberal.—*Rossin House, Toronto; Brockville, Ont.*

FREEMAN, JOHN B. (*North Norfolk.*)

Paternal grandfather was an Englishman, and was one of the first Methodist ministers that settled in the Long Point country. Father occupied several important offices in the Co. of Norfolk. B. in the Tp of Windham, Co. of Norfolk, 22 Aug. 1835. Ed. at the Co. Grammar School. M. in 1861, Jane Scatterd, of Wyton, Co. Middlesex. Is still living on the same farm where both his father and grandfather lived and died. Is a mem. of the Council of Windham and Presdt. of the Co. Agricultural Society. First returned to Parl. at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Windham, Ont.*
