D. Kaper	Secretary Superintending the Indian Dept. C. E.	1825 25 December	Has been employed in the Public Service in Canada, during a period of nearly 33 years:— He resigned the Office of Commissary of Transport at Montreal, upon his Appointment to the Indian Department.
J. Hughes	Superintendent at the Lake of the Two Mountains &c.	August 1833	Served as Resident at Montreal from 1827 to 1830, when the Office was abolished, and Mr Hughes received a Gratuity for his services in that situation. This Officer was ordered to be reduced in October 1837, but in consequence of the Rebellion of that year, he was retained as Resident for a limited period, under the Authority of a Despatch from the Secretary of State of the 28 May 1838. 1847.
