constitute the Special Committee appointed for the purpose of taking into consideration the report of the Special Committee of the House of Commons of the last Session thereof to investigate the Beauharnois Power Project in so far as the said Report relates to any Honourable Members of the Senate, and that the said Committee be authorized to sit during sittings and adjournments of the Senate.

(4) On the same date as follows;

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons requesting that House to grant leave to their Clerk to appear and produce before a Special Committee of the Senate a copy of the evidence adduced during the last Session before the Special Committee of the House of Commons appointed to investigate the Beauharnois Power Project.

- The Committee held Meeting, at which witnesses were examined, including the Honourable Andrew Haydon, a Member of the Senate of Canada; Honourable Wilfrid L. McDougald, also a Member of the Senate; and Honourable Donat Raymond, also a Member of the Senate. The said Members of the Senate were respectively assisted by Counsel at the hearings of the Committee, and Counsel to assist the Committee were also in attendance at the hearings.
- The Committee heard all the statements that said Senators Haydon, McDougald and Raymond desired to make in relation to the said matters of this inquiry, and as well had before it the statements and arguments of Counsel on behalf of said senators respectively.
- The Committee has had before it and has considered the Fourth Report of the Special Committee of the House of Commons referred to it by the Senate; the evidence produced before the said Special Committee of the House of of Commons; and the evidence which was given at its own hearings; and the statements of Counsel; all of which is returned with this Report.
- 5. The Committee reports the following facts and findings on the matters which were referred to it:
