Motion to be introduced to give govt. notices of motion and govt. orders precedence on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, and suspension of rule re Wednesday adjournment.

5. Suspension of Rules of House:

Motion for suspension of Standing Orders 63, 80, 84, 94, 122.

Practice followed in 1914 and 1930.

6. Tabling of Documents:

Re International Situation,

- (a) Selection of Papers;
- (b) To be tabled on Opening day?
- (c) To be printed for distribution in House and Senate at time of tabling?
- (d) To be available for wide distribution outside Parliament?

In 1914 papers re origin of conflict tabled on Opening day; motion for printing following day; printed for wide distribution.

7. Legislative Programme:

- (a) Measures to be introduced;
- (b) Order in which legislation is to be introduced.

Will P.M. wish to ask Ministers to furnish list of measures considered necessary, for their respective Departments?

8. Commission of Internal Economy:

Mr. Ilsley to replace Mr. Dunning (with Messrs Crerar, Lapointe and Euler?)
