I beg to inform you that Mr. Edward Hayden, of Pockmouche, N.B. has written the Department to know if he can purchase a Lot in that Indian Reserve, and upon reference to the records in the Department, it would appear that Lots 22, 29, 30, 31, 32 & 33, have not been sold, although all the other Lots have been reported as having been disposed of prior to Confederation.

I am, therefore, enclosing a blue print copy of Plan of Pockmouche Reserve, and have to request that you will make a careful investigation as to the Lots above named, as appearing unsold, and if occupied, you will obtain and forward to the Department the authority in each case for such occupation, giving name of occupant, and nature of title, if any, under which the property is held.
