Harland Estate- situate on the opposite side of the slough to that occupied by this Reserve and consisting of nearly five hundred acres, a small area of which is being cultivated, is offered for sale, the price asked being \$12,000.00.

2nd. Right of way through the Okanagan Reserve This line passes through a cultivated enclosure near its eastern boundary, cutting off a narrow

near its eastern boundary, cutting off a narrow strip which lies between the Railway and the Eastern of the reserve, thus reducing the value of said strip, on account of the cost of fencing the same: which ewing to the limited area of the strip, as compared with the length of fence required to enclose it must necessarily enhance the said cost to an abnormal amount.

I value the land taken from this reserve at \$55.00, per acre. The land taken for right of way is of the best quality; most of it is clear and ready for plowing.

This is one of the small reserves allotted to the Mkamaplix band of Indians, it is situate South seastward from the small Reserve which lies at the foot of Otter Lake, its area being One hundred and sixty acres.
