I had volunteered for the British Free Corps a few weeks before. A few weeks later I met a person who was called "BARTLETT" at STALAG 3 D and who was incivilian clothes. He told us that he was taking five or six of us to HILDESHEIM, the headquarters of the British Free Corps. On the way down by train "BARTLETT" said if you want to excape I will help you. Bartlett had a Browning revolver on his person and an SS pass and I said nothing at all as I was suspicious.
