

During the early part of July 46 a 'Broncho' issue of
 cigarettes was received by myself and Sgt Perry from
 HQ 48 GI Coy. After issue to the men there was an average
 of cigarettes remaining, mostly cartons and Henlays. As
 far as I am aware there were between 25000 and 30000. These
 cigarettes were stored in Sgt Perry's room. A few days
 after the issue Sgt Perry and I contacted two drivers from
 Shepherd and Stone's in connection with selling the
 cigarettes. I signed the work-ticket for a 15 cwt driver
 by the Shepherd to proceed as detailed to dispose of the
 cigarettes. I then left all further arrangements to Sgt
 Perry. Three or four days later I received 1900 Guilden from Sgt
 Perry and later a further amount which I do not remember as
 my share of the proceeds. I have read over the above
 statement and it is true.
