The following recent statement by Mr. Bryan in regard to the preaching required at the present day will form a fitting close to this great lecture:

"I desire my minister to preach every Sunday the simple gospel. The 'old, old story' never wearies the average congregation, if it comes from a devout mind with preparation in the message. My ideal sermon is one which has an appeal to the unconverted and a spiritual uplift for the I want my minister to be Christian. abreast of the times on all new theological questions and research, but I do not want him to bring them into the pulpit. I have formed certain fixed views of Christ, His gospel, and the inspiration of the Bible from a careful reading of that Book of books, and it will no, make me a better Christian or profit my spiritual life, to unsettle these views by a discussion in the pulpit of new theories of Christ and the Holy Scriptures.
