

Hake and Halibut. The Bays and Rivers abound in Shell fish. The Oysters taken at Bedeque are the finest, and are not excelled on the Continent. March brings us Geese and Brant in large numbers. The favorite resorts for Sportsmen are Tracadie, on the North shore, distant from Charlottetown 14 miles; St. Peter's Island, on the South side, lying outside of the harbor, and distant from Charlottetown 10 miles; St. Peter's Bay on the North side, distant from Charlottetown 30 miles; Richmond Bay, 5 miles from Summerside, and Lennox Island, 16 miles west of Summerside, which is accessible by rail. During the months of August and September we are visited with large flocks of Land Plover, which are found principally on pasture and barren ground, not far from the water. Malpeque (near Summerside) is a favorite resort for Sportsmen in search of Plover. In the rivers and inlets during the months of September and October are found Black Duck in large numbers. During the Autumn months our Partridge and Snipe shooting is considered the finest in America.

INFORMATION FOR TRAVELERS.

The steamers of the Prince Edward Island Steam Navigation Company afford daily communication with the other Maritime Provinces. These boats are first-class in their equipments, and are commanded by men who fully understand their duty, and always render the trip agreeable.

Steamer "M. A. Starr" plys between this port and Halifax weekly, leaving Charlottetown every Thursday, and Halifax every Monday evening.

The boats of the International S. S. Co. leave St. John every Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 8, a. m., arrive at Eastport at 12, m., and leave Eastport at 1, p. m. Arrive at Portland early next morning, and reach Boston same evening. Steamers returning leave Boston same days as above at 8 a. m., leave Portland at 6, p. m., Eastport next day at 9, a. m., and arrive at St. John at 1, p. m.

The "Carroll" and "Worcester," of the Boston and Colonial S. S. Line, sail as follows: Leave Charlottetown every Thursday, at 5, p. m., Port Hawkesbury next morning; leave Halifax for Boston at 4, p. m., Saturday, arriving at Boston Monday morning.

Returning, leave T Wharf, Boston, for the above ports, every Saturday at 12, m., arrive at Halifax at daylight Monday morning; leave Halifax for Port Hawkesbury & Pictou at 12, m.; arrive at Pictou at 4, p. m., Tuesday, and Charlottetown at daylight Wednesday morning.

The Canadian Steamers, (seven in number,) ply between Montreal and Charlottetown, calling at intermediate ports.
