ANCASTER DIRECTORY.

A flourishing village, pleasantly situated in a healthy position, in the township of Ancaster, County of Wentworth. In proportion to its size a good many manufactures are carried on here, among which may be enumerated the factory of the Ancaster Knitting Co., the foundry and machine shop of Messrs. H. & A. Egleston, Thuresson's card clothing factory, with establishments for the making of wag-gons, carriages and agricultural implements, a flour and grist mill and a tannery. There has been recently erected a town hall with fair grounds attached. On account of the salubrity of its situation and the celebrity of its sulphur springs, Ancaster is much frequented by invalids and convalescents in search of health. The Montreal Telegraph Co. has an office here. Stage twice each day between here and Hamilton. Distance from Dundas 3 miles, and from Hamilton 7 miles, fare 25 cents. Mail daily. Population about 600.
