Chicken Puffs.—Mince up together the breast of a chicken, some lean ham, a little parsley, some shallot, and lemon-pee., and season these with pepper, salt, Cayenne, and beaten mace. Let this be on the fire for a few minutes in a little good white sauce. Cut some thinly rolled-out puff-paste into squares, putting on each some of the mince; turn the paste over, fry them in boiling lard, and serve them on a servette. These puffs are very good cold, and they form a convenient supper-dish
