



Synopsis of Canadian North-West. HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

A NY even-numbered socilor of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and An Manitoba Cepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homestended by asy per-son who is the sole brad of a family, or any male over 19 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or leas.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominon Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy, may, however, he made at any Agency on certain condi-tions by the father, mother, son, daushier, brother, or sister of an intending homesteader.

DUTIES. - (1) At least six months' residence upon and cul-tivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acrees in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint owner-shir in land will not meet this re-quirement. (3) A homesteader intending to
