Seeing the old Maori's failing fingers trying to loosen the band round his throat to relieve his pain Sir George rubbed the dying man's chest with a gentle pressure. A sweet smile crossed the native's face. On being asked why he smiled the Maori replied: "My mind has gone back many years. The last hand that touched me as you are doing was my mother's; she used to play with me as a child and tickle me to make me laugh." The little procession which bore the Maori's body to the churchyard was headed by Sir George, and he stood bareheaded by the open grave. Many wondered saying: Why so much notice of a mere Maori? Sir George never thought he had condescended; his great heart felt; he simply expressed his feeling.—Chicago Post.
