Wednesday, 17th April, 1799.

ON motion of Mr. Attorney General, seconded by Mr. Nathaniel Coffin, a Bill to provide houses of Correction in the several districts of the Province: was read for the first time.

ORDERED, that the said Bill be read a second time on Friday next.

The order of the day for the House to resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, to take into consideration the expediency of granting encouragement to a proper commercial intercourse between this Province and His Majesty's colonies and Plantations in the West-Indies, being read—

The House resolved itself into the said Committee.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Berthelot took the Chair of the Committee;

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair.

And Mr. Berthelet reported, that the Committee had made some progress, and had directed him to move for leave to sit again.

Mr. Papineau moved, seconded by Mr. Young, that the Committee

be discharged.

The House divided upon the question,

Yeas 4 Nays 13

And the same being negatived by a majority of nine; the question, that the Committee have leave to sit again? was put; a division again ensued,

Yeas 13 Nays 4

ORDERED, that the faid Committee have leave to fit again.
And then, on motion of Mr. Planté, seconded by Mr. Berthelot,
The House adjourned till Friday next.

Friday, 19th April, 1799.

On motion of Mr. Fisher, seconded by Mr. Berthelot, Ordered, that Mr. Fisher have leave to bring in a Bill to alter and amend such parts of an Act passed in the 36th year of his Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making, repairing and
