TROOP TRAIN
WAS DERAILED

Twenty British Soldiers in South Af-
rica Killed in
Accident

[By Special Wire to the Courier]

LONDON, Sept. 11.—3.53 a.m.

—A Cape Town despatch to Reu-
ter's Telegram Company says

that a troop train, loaded with

600 soldiers on their way to the

coast for shipment to Europe, was

derailed on a sharp curve ever-

looking the Hex River valley in

Cape Colony. The locomotive and

ten coaches plunged over a twenty

foot embankment and six men

were killed and twenty seriously

injured.

The accident probably was due

to the undermining of the tracks

by recent heavy rains.

Except for the fact that the

train was proceeding slowly ow-

ing to the steep grade, the mortal-

ity would have been enormous.

The railroad company is mak-

ing the utmost efforts to clear

away the wreckage as ten other

train loads of troops are being

held up by the wreck, which des-

troys the tracks a great distance.

DEATH AT VALCARTIER.

VALCARTIER CAMP, Que. Sept.

10.—A verdict of death from natural

causes was returned this morning by

a coroner's jury which investigated

the case of Private Desales, aged 42
