Collision off Nantucket Island To-day

New York, May 26—The steamer Ryndam of the Holland-American Line, bound from New York to Ro:erdam with passengers and freight, collided with the Norwegian freight Steamer Jos. J. Cuneo to-day off Nantucket Island. Wireless messages received here said that the Rynda n had transferred her passengers and hat both vessels were badly damaged. It was reported that the battleship Texas and another steamsnip

were going to their aid. The Ryndam, a vessel of 7,376 tons sailed from this port yesterday afternoon with 70 passengers in her first and second cabins and 115 in her hird cabin.

A wireless message to the naval sengers and part of the crew of the Steamer Ryndam, transferred to the steamship Joseph J. Cuneo, after the day, lateer were put aboard the bat tleship South Carolina. The Joseph Cuneo, sailed from Boston last night for Baracoa, Cuba.

ported to have said that the scheme, besides arranging for the payment of war supplies in England, is intended to facilitate French purchases from the Americans, but so far the operation has had little notice able effect on the exchange.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-

WEST LAND REGULATIONS. THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestend a quarter-section of available Dominiou land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

\$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Preption patent may be obtained as soon as mestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased home-stead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.
