FIFTEEN ROUND DRAW

By Special Wire to the Courier. Nanaimo, B. C., May 25—Johnny O'Leary of Seattle and Joe Bayley of Victoria, fought fifteen rounds to a draw yesterday evening.

Collision off Nantucket Island To-day

New York, May 26.—The steamer Ryndam, of the Holland-American line, bound from New York to Rotterdam with passengers and freight, collided with the Norwegian freight steamer Jos. J. Cuneo to-day off Nantucket Island. Wireless messages received here said that the Ryndam had transferred her passengers and part of her crew to the Cuneo, but that both vessels were badly damaged. It was reported that the battleship Texas and another steamship were going to their aid.

The Ryndam, a vessel of 7,376 tons, sailed from this port yesterday afternoon with 70 passengers in her first and second cabins and 115 in her third cabin. A wireless message to the naval radio station here stated that the passengers and part of the crew of the Steamer Ryndam, transferred to the Steamer Joseph J. Cuneo, after the collision of the two vessels early today, later were put aboard the battleship South Carolina. The Joseph J. Cuneo, sailed from Boston last night for Baracoa, Cuba.

The collision occurred shortly after 4 a.m. in latitude 40.2 north, longitude 69.42 west. No details were given as to the circumstances of the accident or the nature of the damages sustained by either vessel, except that the Ryndam was making considerable water.

Further messages from the Ryndam said that one of her holds was full of water and that another hold and the engine room were leaking. She reported that she was steaming slowly towards the port, accompanied by the Cuneo, and would continue to proceed as long as she could master the water in the last compartments. 40 members of the Ryndam's crew, these messages said, remained on board.

A wireless message from Captain Heuvel of the Ryndam, made public by the Holland-American Line at 9 o'clock and received by them less than an hour before, read as follows: "One hundred and fifty miles from Ambrus. Hold five full of water, hold six, water gaining. Engine room water we can master. Am proceeding 13 mile speed. Passengers and 160 crew safely on board Cuneo. American squadron standing by."

Apparently Captain Heuvel was not aware when he sent this message that the passengers had been re-transferred from the Cuneo to the Battleship South Carolina.

Replenish Each Other Reserves

London, May 26.—Although Alexander Ribot, the French minister of finance, announced in Paris last week that he had arranged for the British government to grant credits to France, no official announcement was made here until yesterday, when the Bank of England stated \$2,000,000 sovereigns had been received from abroad. This is the first instalment of \$200,000,000 in gold which is coming from Paris to London to start the credit, and a further \$200,000,000 in treasury bills is expected to be issued to complete the credit.

The French finance minister is reported to have said that the scheme, besides arranging for the payment of war supplies in England, is intended to facilitate French purchases from the Americans, but so far the operation has had little noticeable effect on the exchange.

The arrival of \$200,000,000 is believed the largest billion amount ever announced by the Bank of England in one day. The arrangement of this credit is part of the scheme agreed upon soon after the commencement of war, that the gold reserve of either of the allies should be utilized to replenish that of the other, if it were found necessary at any time to do so.

Advantage has already been taken of the scheme instituted by the Russian government in conjunction with the British authorities to issue treasury bills in London, to relieve Russian commercial paper held up there by reason of the war and exchange difficulties. Several applications have been made for the release of such bills held by the Bank of England.

The "Manitoba" sailing Wednesdays will also call at Owen Sound each sailing date at 10.30 p.m. Special train will leave Union Station, Toronto, at 12.45 p.m. arriving at Port McNicoll 4.00 p.m. daily except Friday.

SECRET MESSAGES

New York, May 26.—Scott R. Hayes, son of former President R. B. Hayes, arrived here to-day from Copenhagen on the Steamship United States. Mr. Hayes had with him as part of his baggage, a sealed canvas pouch bearing the stamp of the Russian government, and addressed to the Russian ambassador at Washington. It had been reported that Mr. Hayes was bearer of confidential government despatches from Petrograd to Washington. A despatch from Copenhagen which told of his departure May 13th for New York so stated, but Mr. Hayes asserted to-day that this was erroneous. He said he did not know what the sealed bag contained. Mr. Hayes said that he had been in Denmark and Russia for the past two months on a business mission, having to do with Russian-American trade after the close of the war.

A DIFFERENT KIND OF COAL

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within five miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 50 acres, on certain conditions. A suitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W. COLEY, C.M.G., Deputy of the Minister of the Interior.
