THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewas or Alborta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominiou Lands Agency or sub-Agency for the district. Purey by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (aut not Sub-Agency.) on certain conditions.
