## LADYSMITH ATHLETICS PLAY HERE SUNDAY

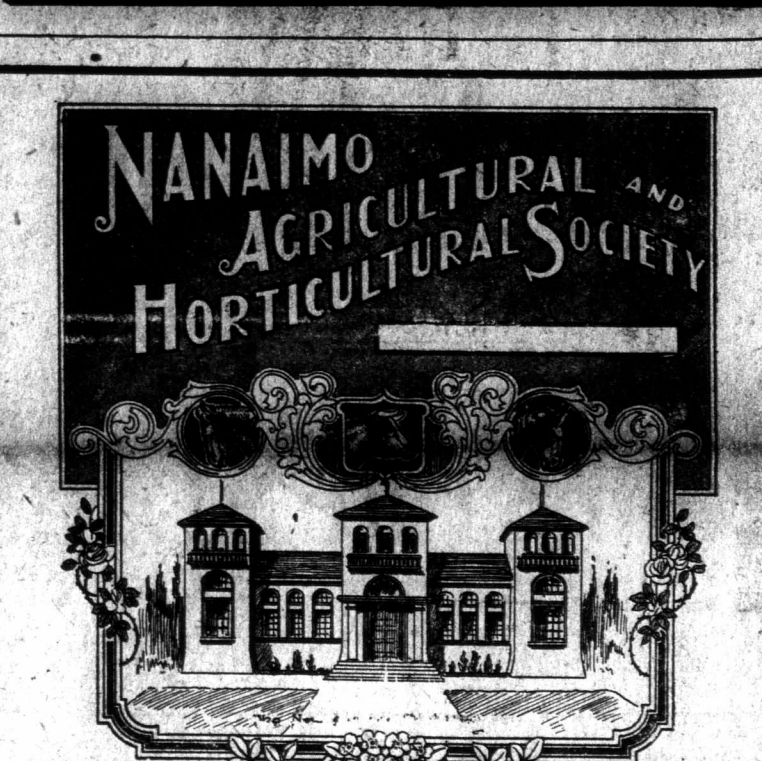
