

OLDEST CUNARD SURGEON DIES; IS BURIED AT SEA
HALIFAX, April 12—The voyage of the steamer Royal George, which arrived in port this morning, from Southampton, direct, was much saddened by the death on April 4th, of the ship's surgeon Dr. James Pointon, the oldest surgeon in the Cunard fleet.
