### Coaker Must Not Control.

Squires has advanced no satisfactory reason why he should be given another lease of power, nor has he made any attempt to explain or defend the terrible blunders of his Government during the past three years. We have so far no assurance from him that if elected he will prevent Coaker running riot with dangerous and senseless legislation that will bring further ruin on our industries. If Squires be sincere in his professions to the public let him at once set the people's minds at ease by a declaration that Coaker will not be given supreme control to do as he wishes, and that he will not be allowed to formulate any legislation that he desires. Unless such a declaration is made we must conclude that the old order will prevail and that Coaker will again take full control of the Government, and reintroduce other legislation in fishery matters that will demoralize even worse than before the trade and business of the country. The people will be on their guard and when Polling Day comes will remove all cause of uncertainty by electing Bennett's men by overwhelming majorities in all the Districts.

Scarlet, greens, grays with vivid greens are a few of the hues promised us. Persian colorings in bathing suits are noticed with interest. Rather full skirts and tight bodices are features of the party shifts. An overblouse of sunburst crepe

de chine is monogrammed in black and finished at the neck and wrists with self-pleatings. It is very comforting to know that at present skirts are to be neither very long nor very short, but quite reasonable in length. A very popular type of blouse is shown in a model of navy blue crepe de chine with deep armholes and rich Egyptian embroidery.
