Homestead Regulations Any even number section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, exception 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for homestead entry or inspection must be made in person by the applicant at the office of the local

An application for entry or inspection made personally at any Sub-agent's office may be wired to the local Agent, by the Sub-agent, the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land will be held un-til the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by mail. priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by mail. In case of "persenation" the entry will be summarily cancelled and the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim.

An applicant for inspection must be eligible for homestead entry, and only one applicant for inspection will be re-\$775 ceived from an individual unti! that application has been disposed of.
A homesteader whose entry is in good standing and not liable to can-
