When the ballots had been counted last night Sir James and his ministers had re ceived, in the net loss of four sup porters and the reduction of the ma orities of his supporters nearly a long the line, an intimation the Liberalism in Ontario has starte new. The new Legislature will b nosed of 82 Conservatives, 22 Lit endent Conservative. The Govern ent will hus, after appointing beaker, have a majority of 59. Th last House was composed of 86 Con ervatives, 18 Liberals, and one Labo nember, the Gevernment majority ove all being 67.

The most surprising feature of th ection was the comparative large number of constituencies that changof their allegiance.

The Liberals gained eleven seats and lost seven, while in one riling, Rainy River, the Government candipendent Conservative.
