If it appears that a considerable increase in the police force is necessary and the regular funds of the city are not sufficient, the mayor says that he may ask the citizens of Seattle to make up money enough for the increase.

The influx from San Francisco is expected within a few days. Mayor Moore's instructions to the police will be strict, and saloon loiterers, petty thieves and chronic vagrants will be treated with scant courtesy by the police.
