Buffalo, N.Y., Dec. 13.—The shipments of coal by lake during the season of navigation just closed aggregated 2,485.—255 tons, 220,000 less than last year, and 367,000 tons less than two years ago. Of this year's total, 16,030 tons went to Canada, which is a falling off of 11,320 tons, as compared with the preceding year, and of 16,500 tons, as compared with 1892.
