CLERGY RESERVES ACT.

The following is a correct copy of the Reserve Bill as it passed the two Houses of the Legislature :-

An Act to make better provision for the appropriation of Monies arising from the Lands heretofore known as the Clergy Reserves, by rendering them available for Municipal purposes.

Whereas by the Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, passed in the Session hold in the thirtyand of Lower Canada respectively, or the person administering the Government therein, to make from out of the Lands of the Crown within such Provinces, such allotment and appropriation of Lands as therein mentioned, for the support and maintenance of a Protestant Clergy within the same; and it was further enacted, that all and every the rents, profits and emoluments which might at any time arise maintenance and support of a Protestant Clergy within the Province in which the same should be situated, and to no other purpose whatever And whereas in pursuance of the said Act, such on Sunday morning last a sermon was preached in the College Chapel by the Lord Bishop of the monies so invested should be appropriate the appropriation and application of such protection, after which an offertory was made for the purposes of the Patriotic Fund.
