

## Scientific and Aseful.

BOILED ICEING .- Mix two tablespoonfuls of cold water with a cup of granulated sugar, and boil until it ropes. Take off and attrin the white of one beaten egg and flavour with lemon juice or tartatic acid.

HOUSEHOLD MATS. — Something quite elegant may be made out of odd pieces of tapestry carpei. You must unravel the yarn and wind it in a ball. Then get a pair of large knitting needles, cast on 100 stitches; close your left hand and wrap the yarn four times around it, knit off the stick, taking up all the yarn on your left hand with it. Re peat the same process at every stitch, until you have finished your needle. Knit the next row plain, and so on until you have a square. Line this with a piece of carpet, and you have the art-mats of the season.

LEMON CAKE.—A delicious lemon jelly cake which will keep well, and which is in fact better after having been kept for a week, is an easily obtained iuxury. Take two cups of sugar, half a cup of butter, one cup of milk, three eggs, two and one-half teaspoonfuls of baking powder, and three cups of flour. This makes five layers. For the jelly use the grated rind of two large lemons and the juice also, one cup of sugar, one egg, half a cup of water, one teaspoonful of hutter, one tablespoonful of flour mixed with a little water; boil until it thickens, and then place between the layers of cake.

To Cook a Goose Nicely.—After dressing the fowl nicely, put it in a deep pan, pour boiling water over it, and let it stand till cold, all night if convenient. When cold, wash it off and wipe it dry; then put it over the fue in cold water, and let it come to a boil; take it out and wipe it again. In this way you remove nearly all the strong oily taste. Stuff it with a dressing of bread only to the control of the strong of the cold of th stuffed—is the rule for fowls.

DUTCH CAKES.—Propare a puff-paste with a pound of flour and three-quarters of batter, give it six turns; when set, roll the oaste out nearly half an inch thick, divide it into rounds of two inches diameter, or rather more, with a tin cutter channelled, as for large "bouchees." Spread a layer of powdered sugar on a table, take up the rounds of paste one by one, dip one of their side, into the flour, the other into the sugar; place them on the table with their sugared side up, and roll the rounds out again, giving them as length of four inches; arrange them on baking-sheet on their floured side, and o't little distances one from the other. Bakes them in a moderate oven, giving them a nicely gold colour. DUTCH CAKES .- Propare a puff-paste

PREPARING POTATOES.—A simple but delicate way of preparing potatoes is a factorized form of preparing potatoes are washed and grated; four ounces each are added of sugar and butter melted, one teaspoonful each of salt and pepper, mixed well together, placed in a baking dish and put in a brisk oven until done and it shews a delicate brown colour. Another mode of preparing potatoes by the French, after the potatoes are boiled in their jackets, is to peel and mash them with a fork; put them into a stewpan with some butter and salt, moisten through with cream and let them grow dry while stirring them over the fire; add more cream and continue adding for nearly an hour; turn them into a dish and brown them on the top with a salamander.
