ROYAL CANADIAN MOUNTED POLICE INQUIRY AS TO NUMBER OF DEATHS BY

SUICIDE

On the orders of the day:

Mr. Eldon M. Woolliams (Bow River): I have a question for the Minister of Justice. It arises out of a question placed on the order paper by the hon. member for Villeneuve, and the answer thereto. The question was No. 1,975, relating to deaths of serving members of the R.C.M.P. between October 1, 1954 and September 30, 1964. In his answer the hon. gentleman said that of 123 deceased serving members, 61 had died of natural causes, 41 by accidental death and 2 by misadventure; 5 were murdered and 14 had committed suicide.

When I first read the answer I wondered whether that last figure was a misprint. If it is not, perhaps the minister would explain why there is such a high rate of suicide in the R.C.M.P.

Hon. Guy Favreau (Minister of Justice): This matter will be completely explained when my estimates are considered on Monday.

Mr. Woolliams: Because of the noise made by certain members of the Liberal party I results announced within a short time. [Mr. Diefenbaker.]

Minister would be most glad to answer that was unable to hear the answer. I wonder if we could have a little order. This is a serious matter. I respect the R.C.M.P., even if members opposite do not.
