## UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT

MEASURE TO BROADEN COVERAGE

The house resumed from Friday, February 16, consideration of the motion of Mr. Mac-Eachen [for Mr. Nicholson] for the second reading of Bill No. C-197, to amend the Unemployment Insurance Act.

Mr. Speaker: Order, please. When this item was last being considered the hon, member for Compton-Frontenac (Mr. Latulippe) had the floor.

Mr. Latulippe: Mr. Speaker, I had completed my remarks.

Mr. Arnold Peters (Timiskaming): Mr. Speaker, after what has happened in the last few days our discussion on Bill C-197 will bring about a change of pace. Nevertheless, the subject matter of this bill is of tremendous interest to those seeking to collect unemployment insurance benefits.

This bill seeks to increase insurance benefits. At the same time many in this country think that some problem areas in connection with employment and unemployment insurance need correcting. For instance, in my area—and I understand that this is so in many other areas-many unemployment insurance offices have closed. They have moved to larger centres and in those centres, with the help of computers and so on, many individual unemployment insurance commission services have been amalgamated. The result is that in my area there is no qualified staff to help applicants file claims for unemployment insurance benefits. Also, there is no one to help with appeals, which have to be conducted at arms length with offices that are many hundreds of miles away. The department says that this is temporary, and that the
