HOUSE OF COMMONS

BROADCASTING-REFERENCE TO STANDING COMMITTEE

Hon. Jean J. Charest (Minister of State (Youth) and Minister of State (Fitness and Amateur Sport)): Mr. Speaker, after the usual discussions between the Government and opposition Parties, I would like to put forward the following motion:

That the entire subject matter of both radio and television broadcasting of the proceedings of the House of Commons and its committees, including the legal, procedural and technical aspects thereof, be referred for examination, study and report to the Standing Committee on Elections, Privileges, Procedure and Private Member's Business, with such study, to include an examination of the subject matter of the proposal by Cableco and the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation for licence to operate a specialty programming network, styled the Canadian Parliamentary Channel CPAC;

That, the committee and members of the committee have the power, when the committee deems it necessary, to adjourn or travel from place to place inside and outside Canada and that, when deemed necessary, the required staff accompany the committee or members of the committee, as the case may be; and that, notwithstanding the usual practices of this House, if the House is not sitting when an interim or final report of the committee is completed, the committee shall report its findings by depositing with the Clerk of the House and the report shall thereupon be deemed to have been laid upon the Table; and

That the committee shall report to the House not later than December 31, 1989.
