## the connecration cememony.

Tho Most Rev. Ir. Joseph Hoare, was on Tuedday consecrated Biahop of Ardagb, and Olonmacnoise, in succes. sion of the Most liev. Dr. Woodlock, resigned. The Feast of St. Josepi was chosen by the now prelatn as the dato for his reception into tho episco pacy. Not in the town of Longford alone hut throughont the diocese the day was observed as a gencral holiday. From all parts of the diocese the laity and clergy came to assiat at the cere. mones. Tho cathedral wat filled to its utmost capacity with a congregation representativo of all portions of the See. His Eaninence Cardinal Logue, Primate of All Ireland, was consecrating prelate. The asaistant prelates were the Most Rov. Dr. Nulty, Bishop of Meath, and the Most Mev. Dr. Mc(iivern, Bishop of Dromore. The assistants to the Cardinal at the throne wero:- Very IRev. Canon M Cartan, of Ionaghmore, und Rev. Futher SheriMan. After the Firat Gospel the Rev. Nicholas Walah, S.J., rector, Miltown lark, taking for his text the words of the first verse of the third chapter of Epistlo of St. Yaul to the Mebrews : "Wherefore, holy brethern, consider the high priest of your confession, Jesus "-preached an elcquent seraon adpropriate to the occasion.

Bishop Hoare was born in April, 1842, at 13xillynahon County Longford, Ireland, and received his intermediate education at Mount Melleray Oollege, County Waterford, and Canon Reynolds' Day School, Longford- He entered Maynooth in 1871 , and was ordained in 1867 . In that year he was appointed Carate of St Mel's Cathedral, Longford, where he labored during scren yeare In the year 1575, on ibe resignation of the Very Rer. Matthew Columb of the office of Preaident of St. IIel's Collese, Father Hoare was selected to fill the vacancy. Being an
