HURLED INTO WATER. Six British Seamen Clung to Wreckage and Only Three Lived.

To be blown up in the air when their ship was torpedoed by a German U-boat was the terrible experience of the crew of the British steamer Joshua Nicholson.

The steamer Joshua Nicholson was torpedoed by a German submarine without warning. She began to settle rapidly into a heavy list to starboard. While the port lifeboat was being lowered she capsized and three men were drowned. Another man was blown into the water by an explosion. After the ship had gone down six men came to the surface and clung to pieces of wreckage. Of these, three sank during the next few hours, the remaining three being picked up at about 5 p.m., exhausted but alive.

Holed by a German petard, six members of the merchant marine lost their lives. Their dependents are secure in the hands of the Navy League of Canada and the \$1,000,000 fund will raise in Ontario during "sailors' week," Sept. 1 to 7.
