

Fugitive President of Wrecked Bank Caught in Mexico. Chicago, Aug. 22 .- The Record-Herald Chicago, Aug. 22.—The Record-Herald says: A private despatch received in Chicago from El Paso at midnignt, re-ported positively the arrest of Paul O. Stensland, fugitive president of the wrecked Milwaukee-avenue State Bank, at Aguas Calientes, Mexico. A telegram was at once sent to Springfield to ascertain whether Gov. Springheid to ascertain whether Gov. Deneen had been notified of the arrest and what action had been taken looking to the extradition of the fugitive. It was learned that a telegram had been received by the governer, which is new in the hands of his secretary. Chicago police claim to have received no information of the arrest. Montreal Live Stock.
