COMPANY TO REMOVE POLES RAILWAY BOARD ARBITRATES

Amicable Settlement of City and Street Railway Dispute is Arrived At.

A peaceful solution of the difficulty between the city and the Street Railway Co. as to the removal of objectionable wooden poles was reached yesterday morning, when Manager Fleming conferred with City Solicitor Chisholm, and it was decided that the company should remove the poles from the roadways where they are dangerous to traffic and erect iron poles outside the curb; the question as to which party shall pay the cost to be determined by the Ontario Railway Commission.

CARE OF MILK.

Provincial Board of Health Issues a Circular. The provincial board of health has issued a circular to the dairymen respecting the care of milk. It insists upon clean strainers and glasses, the immediate cooling of the milk and its storage in some cool place free from all noxious odors. It is pointed out that the cows should not have access to filth pools and sloughs. The many illnesses attributed to improper milk supply make the circular very timely, and it is to be hoped effective.
