"As to the cavalry, their methods are quite different from ours. American cavairy acts chiefly as the eyes and ears of the main body, and as mounted infantry. We consider that the days when the masses of cavalry charges are still regarded as feasible. Another great war will slone decide whether the latter idea is justified.

"One thing the cavalry operations brought out was the clever horsemanship of the French officers. 


