PUBLIC POWER NEAR.

Nothing more important can be mentioned at present in connection with the hydro-electric power situation as far as the interests of the city are concerned, than the near approach of the delivery of city power. Electric power has been talked about so long that the citizens need not be blamed for failing to realize that it is almost at their doors. Construction is going on at a very rapid rate, and in four months the power will be ready for distribution.

Naturally the Toronto Electric Light Co. is taking every precaution that business prudence dictates in the face of such competition. That the company did not accept a fair offer of expropriation should not be allowed to cloud the issues that remain. The city quite properly refused to be held up to exorbitant charges on the one hand, or unreasonable terms on the other. Now that this stage of negotiation has been passed, and even before it, the Toronto Electric Light Co. is straining every nerve to secure customers on long term contracts. Every one of these means greater difficulty for the city in establishing its plant and service. But the company has done more and in a number of instances has insisted on the installation of forms of motors which would effectively prevent the use of city power when it comes along, without the additional expense of a new motor.

No fault can be found with the company for pursuing its own interests, unless, as has been reported, these installations and contracts have been secured by misrepresentation. Citizens who use or intend to use electric power would do well to acquaint themselves with the conditions and terms offered by the city, before committing themselves to irremediable engagements elsewhere.

THE BRITISH BUDGET FIGHT.

Discussion, both in the press and on the platform, regarding the constitutional right of the house of lords to end or amend budget proposals goes on in Britain with unabated ardor. Nor are the party leaders backward in threats and menaces, the so far as the opposition is concerned, they are careful not to leave themselves without a line of retreat. Lord Lansdowne indeed found it necessary to damp the enthusiasm of the "more militant section of the Unionist party, who hailed with approval his reported declaration that the peers would not pass the budget without "mincing." This was accepted as a sage of battle, but Lord Lansdowne hastened to explain that his remark was wrongly reported and that the word he really applied was "winning." The alteration in the initial letter made a considerable difference, since in its amended form the phrase rather implied that the dose, however unpleasant, might have to be swallowed.

The opposition tactics in the house of commons scarcely encourage the belief that Mr. Balfour is spilling for a chance to force a government crisis. He and his henchmen are fighting the budget proposals line by line and even word by word, conduct which, if persevered in, may delay their consideration by the house of lords till late in the autumn, however stringent the form of closure that is applied. This is all the more peculiar when it is remembered that the new land taxation has been definitely singled out as the crucial point of the budget and that no readiness has been exhibited to offer tariff reform as the official alternative, although it has been made so to appear in individual declarations, notably by Lord Lansdowne himself. This disinclination is probably due to the fact that the opposition leaders are not yet prepared to bind themselves to specific tariff schedules, particularly as regards food taxation. The political situation undoubtedly has bettered for the government both in and out of parliament and the ministerialists now that they have something definite to fight for, have picked up heart very strikingly.

PUBLIC SERVICES AND PRIVATE INTEREST.

One of the best arguments in favor of public ownership and operation of service and utility monopolies is the radical conflict between the views of private companies and the public interest. As Mr. Henniker Heaton has very clearly pointed out in the case of the cable companies, they find less risk in a comparatively small business at high rates than in a much larger business at low rates. Private companies set out with the primary notion that profits must be earned in every way that the law permits, and often in ways that the law does not permit, but which it is abundantly difficult to expose and punish. Now, so far as the public is concerned, the object of a public service is to accommodate as many individuals as possible at the cheapest cost. For that reason the directors of publicly owned enterprises are expected to encourage travel, communication, the use of the best illuminants and sources of power, and, in fact, to give to the poorest everything really necessary, which, with different ideas and principles guiding them, private corporations would reserve for the rich, or at best, the comfortably well-to-do.

Railway companies in Canada, for example, discourage cheap travel, cable companies discourage cheap communication, electric light and power companies want high rates and fewer customers, instead of many customers.

at lower rates. Street railway companies will not extend to districts where they think lines will not pay—they want to serve congested sections, where passengers are numerous and profitable. This same objection to multiply service in order that it may be cheap is common to all public service companies, and they habitually oppose to the utmost every effort to have them adopt the fundamental principle of a successful public service—the greatest good to the greatest number. What renders their rule and practice still more reprehensible is the fact that wrong and improper methods of increasing their profits are in constant use. Stock issues are manipulated in order to conceal the actual profits earned, in order to lay greater burdens on the general community and thus secure for those in control an opportunity to amass wealth at the expense of the public and often of the shareholders. Public ownership and operation prevents all these things and its one aim is to give the best and widest service at the lowest cost possible. It can do this because, no disturbing motive intervenes between the public need and the public service.

WESTERN CANADA IRRIGATION

First Convention Closed—Important Resolutions Passed.

LETHBRIDGE, Alta., Aug. 8.—(Special.)—The Western Canada Irrigation convention closed Saturday afternoon, to meet next year at Kamloops, B. C. The appointment of a permanent secretary was authorized and resolutions were adopted requesting British Columbia and Alberta governments to issue a bulletin regarding irrigation. Another sought to place the responsibility of keeping ditches free of weeds on those responsible for their maintenance.

The government will be asked to set aside the entire eastern slope of the Rockies as a forest reserve, in order to save the Alberta rivers, and the convention urged tentative agreements between the government and the irrigation companies regarding the construction of bridges, pending a settlement of pending suits.

WAS THIS CANINE MAD? NORTH END GIVEN SCARE

Two Persons Received Bites From Animal Which Boldly Attacked Passers-by

It is decidedly more pleasant to recline on an easy chair at home and read Conan Doyle's thrilling narrative of "The Hound of the Baskervilles," than to undergo the experience of being quarried for a large and determined canine. Street residents are unanimous on the point.

A big brown dog created, all by himself, a reign of terror in the neighborhood of Collier-street and Markham-street Saturday afternoon. A number of people saw him, but nobody seems to know his exact breed for the reason that their inspection was superficial, not to say hurried. It was a day of excitement, but for all that more than one citizen surprised himself and neighbors by the agility of his footwork.

A resident of Collier-street, strolling homeward, heard the quick patter of paws behind him. Turning he beheld a brown dog. He didn't like its looks, although he decided afterwards that it might not have been so large as it appeared to him then. It had froth about the mouth and the terrors of rabies were painted vividly before him. He bolted, and not too soon, for as he slammed the door behind him, he heard a thud as the animal's body was hurled against it.

Two little girls encountered the dog a little later. He sprang at one of them, biting her on the arm. A man came to her rescue, striking the animal with a stick, whereupon it leaped upon him and its teeth closed on his arm, after which it ran away.

Several other people were chased by the canine, whose fell reputation traveled rapidly in the neighborhood. Mothers kept their children at their apron strings and the heads of households talked from verandahs of organizing a posse and its speedy closure on the wayward dog.

The canine terror caused a panic by suddenly appearing on a verandah where there were a number of children, one of whom had previously been bitten. They scurried indoors and a valiant citizen turned a garden hose on the dog. Undaunted by the douche it bore a straight course for him and dropping the hose, he fled into the house.

It remained for the policeman on the beat to get George and Dragon, act. Numerous complaints had been made, and he was prepared for the dog. With a well directed bullet he laid the animal dead.

There is doubt as to whether the animal was really afflicted with rabies or whether the hot weather merely brought out a fit, but owing to the fact that at least two persons were bitten, uneasiness exists. The dog's head will probably be examined for traces of the disease.

Failures of the Week.

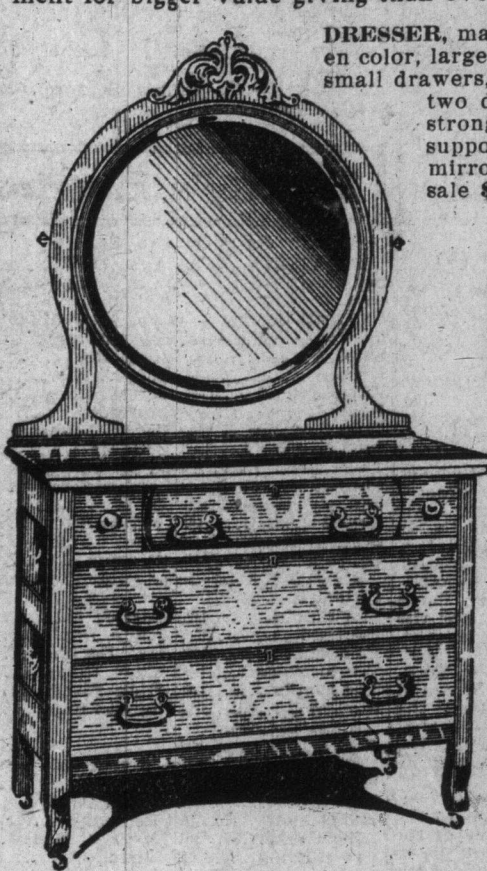
