Some of the difficulties facing the Government are the Home-Steading Bill and Criminal Code Amendment—Intercolonial Extension into Montreal to be Thru-sold and a Crown's Nest Policy to be Evolved—There is the Troublesome Prohibition Bill—Mr. Cameron's Bill on the Waste of Time—General News from the Capital.

Ottawa, May 16.—(Special.)—The possibility of prorogation on June 10 faces into improbability as the sessional program is reviewed. There are now on the order paper the civil service superannuation bill, the franchise bill and a slightly bill in amendment to the criminal code. Then there is the Government's policy of extending the Intercolonial railway to Montreal, involving a right of way bill, and a bill to be voted through; there is a Crown's Nest Policy to be defined for the Government; there is a bill to amend the Criminal Code, involving a question upon which the West is so vitally interested. (From Our Special Correspondent) London, May 8.—"Canada and the Canadians" briefly expresses what has been on everyone's lips here for the past fortnight. It is not too much to say that the Dominion has been more talked of in club, market and street, since the fatal 22nd of April than at any other time in her history. As a genuine advertising medium, tariff changes of the new stamp are worth a hundred emigration agents. At this time, when many here in England are predicting a further increase in the value of the pound, and when the Continental press seems eager to hurry her one more into the position of splendid isolation, the news of a welcome message and was everywhere received with satisfaction and delight. For the moment the troubles in the East were overshadowed by the word from the far West, and the feeling of enthusiasm for Canada's action has not yet subsided.
