BOARD OF COMMERCE HADS OUT FINING

(Continued from Page 1.)

The Board's Decision. The judgment of the board, which was signed by both commissioners, was read to the court by Mr. Murdoch. The judgment after reciting in detail the preliminary steps taken by the representative of the attorney-general for Ontario and the board of commerce to institute proceedings, says in part in that connection:

Two Causes Suggested. The board proposed that the manufacturers (which involve wholesalers and possibly some retailers as well, the board pointed out) which have been in the habit of their own motion, and was carrying on this proposed to conclude as follows: as proposed, a Dominion-wide system of control, under which the effects and legality of price-fixing agreements, including an enquiry into the cost of production and profit of each upon commodities being sold under the next resale price plan of merchandising, which would be made a part of the law, and the board constituted prime and necessary elements in consideration of the interest of the public. In the board's opinion, the proposed enquiry, at the instance of the Ontario attorney-general, as compared with the board's proposal, would be only be superficial and incomplete. The attorney-general's representative expressing his principal objection to the proposed enquiry, the board proposed to him two alternatives:

(1) It would grant its consent to the attorney-general of Ontario to proceed in the way of indictment under section 418 of the criminal code, if that consent were desired; or

(2) It would, upon the complaint of representatives of the attorney-general, undertake an investigation under Part IV of the Combines and Fair Prices Act, 1919, under the attorney-general's responsibility, if being the board's opinion that the evidence produced had not satisfied the board as to the public interest as distinguished from public interest and that unless other additional evidence was produced, the proceedings must fall. Mr. Reebuck returned to Toronto and some days later supplied the necessary evidence to the board. The board, upon the second of the mentioned alternatives, Commissioner Murdoch granted the application and the board proceeded to hear the evidence of the attorney-general and one in the hearing of argument, to the end that the materials adduced failed of their object: that if it were obligatory upon the board to now render a decision, it would be entirely in favour of the attorney-general, and that the board would be bound to finally decide upon the fragmentary and insufficient materials which have been set before it. Only such matters as have been properly charged need be decided.

The charge dismissed. The board's price fixing combination against the Hamilton retail grocers stands entirely disproved and is dismissed. These retail grocers, however, must not assume that because of the dismissal of the charge laid against them any species of concerted action on their part as to buying or selling prices is necessarily legal. The board reserves certain powers as to the law of combinations until the conclusion of certain intended additional investigations hereinafter mentioned.

Disaffection With Case. As to the remainder of the charges affecting the wholesalers and manufacturers, the board expresses its complete disaffection with the case as presented, and its resolve not to permit the charges to be dropped in the incomplete condition as to proof in which they have been left. Accordingly in these proceedings, the board has decided to drop the charges, and to refer the matter to the board neither acquits nor condemns any wholesaler, manufacturer or association. Only such matters as have been properly charged need be decided.

MIGHT NOT QUIT NEUTRAL RUHR ZONE

French Premier Says It Would Be Dangerous to Let in German Troops.

Paris, March 26.—Premier Millerand, replying in the chamber of deputies today to the interpellation of former Premier Barthou on Thursday, said: "A crisis of alliances does not exist. There is only the natural give-and-take of conversations."

With regard to the Russian soviet government, the premier declared: "The allies can only recognize the Russian government when the government recognizes national sovereignty in acts as well as in words. The French government was prepared to act like the United States, entering upon like commercial and industrial relations with Russia without having relations with the soviet government, the premier said.

Concerning Turkey, the premier asserted that the allies wish to create a Turkey which can live, such a Turkey as will not be incompatible with the liberty of the straits, guaranteed by the international organization, now with the safeguarding of France's economic and financial interests in Turkey.

Mr. Millerand read a report on attacks against English, French and Belgian officers in Berlin and Brno, and presented a scheme for moral and material reparations and punishment with fresh guarantees.
