Importers and dealers are earnestly called upon, seriously to reflect on the direful results of their trade in ardent spirits; we fear that the tears of the widow, the cries of the orphan, and the groans of the dying victim, will rise up to Heaven as a testimony against them; can they expect a blessing upon their exertions? will their profits afford them any consolation at that awful period when this world is receding from them forever?
