Three Canadians Get Highest Military Honor

London, June 23--No fewer than twenty-eight pages of military honors were gasetted today, mostly for services in the field. Among the eight Victoria Crosses given, three go to Canadians--Captain Francis Springer of the Army Medical Service, Color Sergeant Fred Hall of the Eight Battalion and Lance Corporal Fred Fisher of the Thirtieth Battalion, all for extreme bravery in the neighborhood of Ypres.

OFFER OF PARKS HOUSE REPORTED ACCEPTED Will be Used for Recuperation Time of Wounded Soldiers

According to information received by The Times today, it is understood that the government has accepted the generous offer of the estate of the late J. R.
