

## BRITISH SOLDIER BETTER THAN EVER BEFORE

General MacBrien Tells of  
Result of Recent Army  
Manoeuvres

MECHANICAL ADVANCE  
PARTICULARLY NOTED

Tanks, Planes, Artillery and  
Defence Units Highly  
Developed

Interviewed at Quebec on his return from England, where he attended the recent army manoeuvres, Major General J. H. MacBrien, chief of staff of the Department of National Defence, who will attend an armistice reunion dinner here next month, says that the British soldier of today is better than ever before.

General MacBrien said that the manoeuvres, which were the first held since 1918, were participated in by four divisions of infantry and one territorial battalion, slightly over 50,000 men.

### OPEN WARFARE

This was the first opportunity afforded of gaining experience in open warfare since the Great War. Another object of the manoeuvres was to test new and improved instruments of war. The advance made in scientific weapons for use on the ground and in the air since the Great War has been considerable, he said, and therefore soldiers must study their effect and become familiar with their use. Interest was technical as well as tactical.

Some of the weapons are improved tanks, armored cars, airplanes, tractors and mechanicalized artillery. An interesting feature to note was the varying rate of movement of the various component units of a modern army, from the airplane at 180 to 200 miles an hour, the armored car at 40 to 60 miles, the tank at 30 miles and the infantry at three miles an hour.

### MORE COMPLICATED

From these facts about a modern army, General MacBrien said, it was easy to see that war is constantly becoming more complicated and that more study and experience are needed by all ranks, but especially those who will have the responsibility of commanding units in war time. On the whole, the manoeuvres had been a great success, he said, and valuable lessons were learned from them. He declared that the British soldier today is better than ever before. Their marching and discipline, physical fitness and individual training are of a very high order.

### JAPANESE COMPARISON

Last year he had had the pleasure of being present at the great Japanese manoeuvres and he had been struck by the apparent athletic appearance of the Japanese soldiers, but the British soldier is every bit as physically fit as the Japanese. He found that the men in the army today appear to be younger generally, are all in the pink of condition, alert and of better education than was the case in England before the Great War.

When asked if there was any foundation to the story which was cable to America from London to the effect that the manoeuvres had shown to the heads of the British militia that the present army was not numerically strong enough for defensive purposes, General MacBrien said that that was a matter of individual opinion. The British army is larger than before the war and considered strong enough for the present.

### CANADIAN PACIFIC MOUNT COMPARTMENT SLEEPERS

Patrons desiring strict privacy with all the comforts and accommodations offered in drawing-rooms, or those who heretofore have been unable to secure drawing-room, will find the compartment of the greatest benefit.

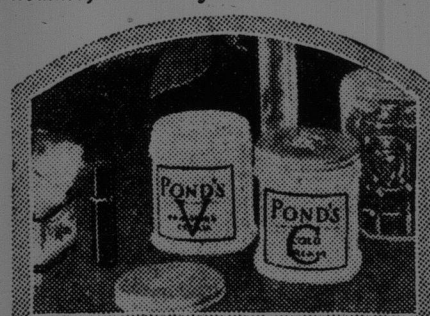

## WRECK IS SIGHTED

Is Motor-Boat and Lies 65 Miles From Boston Lightship.

BOSTON, Oct. 20.—Captain George A. Murley, of the British steamer Heathpool, Halifax, for Boston, today reported sighting the wreck of a motor boat, 65 miles east by south of Boston lightship.

The vessel was partially submerged, and the bow, which projected ten feet above water, carried no name or number. The boat was described as 80 to 90 feet long, painted white with brown bottom and brass railings leading to the bow.

No motor boat answering the description had been reported missing and coast guard officials here said none of their patrols had been in battle with a run-runner recently.
