# JAS. W. POWER'S REVIEW OF THE TURF SEASON

Five Track Records in the  
Maritime Provinces  
Lowered

Thirty-one Horses Entered  
2.31 List and Thirty Al-  
ready There Reduced  
Their Records—Fewer  
Regular Meetings; More  
Matinees.

Halifax, N. S., Nov. 18.—The thirty-fourth annual review of the harness turf season in the Maritime Provinces, by James W. Power, sporting editor of the Acadia Recorder, shows a falling off in the number of regular meetings, totalling but forty-one, though there were more matinee racing meets than ever before, thirty of these having been held. The most important meetings were those in New Brunswick, with Cape Breton having the largest number in Nova Scotia and Charlottetown having its regular Exhibition meeting, though reduced to three days. An interesting feature of the season was racing on the Halifax track for the first time since the explosion in 1917, two regular meetings having been held.

Five hundred and thirty-six heats were trotted or paced for money in the Provinces during the season with four heats from 2:08 1/4 to 2:09 1/4, sixty-one from 2:10 1/4 to 2:15, 200 from 2:15 to 2:20, 203 from 2:20 to 2:25, and sixty-eight from 2:25 to 2:30. The fastest mile of the year on a Provincial track was 2:08 1/4 at Woodstock, N. B., by John R. Braden 2:08 1/4, holder of the Maritime Province record 2:07 1/4, owned by the Moose Club of Presque Isle, Me., and driven by John Wilford.

The performance of maritime bred horses abroad was most striking. Bill Sharon, bred by J. S. Doyle, Fredericton, N. B., to Tommy Murphy's stables, trotted in 2:04 1/4 at Philadelphia, the fastest mile ever made by a trotter bred in the Maritime Provinces, and Brage, 2:07 1/4, bred by R. H. Edwards, Halifax, won the grand prize of Antwerp, at Brussels.

Five track records were lowered: Truro to 2:15 by Dick C. 2:15 1/4; Edmonston, N. B., to 2:14 1/4 by College Swift, 2:11 1/4; North Sydney to 2:13 1/4 by Roy Vok, 2:08 1/4; and by White Sox 2:03 1/4; Marie, P. E. I., to 2:17 1/4 by Edgerton, 2:15 1/4; Inverness to 2:16 1/4 by Colorado 1, 2:16 1/4; and Lott's Axworthy, 2:18 1/4.

Bonny Girl, driven by W. H. Nevers, lowered the three years old trotting record one quarter second, when she won the third heat at Fredericton at 2:19 1/4. Peter Tancie, also driven by Nevers, lowered the three year old pacing record at Woodstock 2:17 1/4. Roy Grattan, 2:04 1/4, driven by Billy Cummings, lowered the pacing record for a gelding on a Maritime Province track to 2:09 1/4 at Woodstock. Lambert Todd, driven by Utton, paced the fastest mile ever made by a new per-

former on a Provincial track in 2:10 1/4 at Fredericton, and his three winning miles of 2:10 1/4, 2:10 1/4, 2:12 1/4 were also the fastest three heats by a newcomer. Crescendo, owned by A. E. Tritter, Salisbury, N. B., and in the stables of D. H. McAllister, Sussex and driven by Fred Cameron with his mile of 2:13 1/4, at Houlton, Me., is the fastest new performer ever bred in the Maritime Provinces. His mile at Woodstock, N. B., in 2:16 1/4, was the fastest made by a Maritime Province bred pacer on a provincial track this year.

Bud Hal, owned by L. R. Acker, Halifax and driven by O. Steele with his heat of 2:10 1/4 at St. Stephen lowered the record for geldings owned in the Provinces. Edgerton, 2:15 1/4, owned by John McDonald, Charlottetown was the fastest new performer of the year, owned in the Maritime Provinces, on a provincial track.

Miss Simmassie, 2:19 1/4, owned by Frank R. Little, Halifax, and driven by Frank Boutillier, Halifax was the fastest provincial bred mare of the season to enter the list. Keenah Aubrey, 2:17 1/4, owned and driven by E. Stewart, Summerside, was the fastest Maritime Province bred mare of the season. The Express owned by H. C. Jewett, Fredericton, driven by Dr. McCoy, at Moncton and the Boston gelding Red Russell at Fredericton, trotted the fastest mile of the season on a provincial track, 2:14 1/2. Better Not, owned by E. Rutherford, Sydney, trotted the fastest mile of the season by a mare owned in the Maritime Provinces. Her time made at Charlottetown was 2:18.

Thirty-one horses either owned in the provinces or with records made on provincial tracks entered the 2:30 list and thirty already in the list reduced their records. The following are the new 2:30 performers:

**SOLDIER'S HISTORY TO BE RE-WRITTEN**  
Employment Sheet is to Be Kept From Conduct.  
London, Nov. 8.—(By Mail)—Amendments to King's regulations provide for the keeping of an employment sheet for every soldier independent of his conduct sheet (which will be confined to military matters).  
It is laid down that the employment sheet is to form a "history" to show the capabilities and qualifications of a soldier for employment in civil life to be made up annually, and whenever a soldier is transferred to another unit.  
This summary is to indicate the soldier's merits and (if necessary) his defects under such heads as—Industry, energy, cleanliness, trustworthiness, intelligence, initiative, self reliance, capacity for continuous hard work, educational standard.  
Special mention will be made of any occupation likely to be of use to the soldier in civil life.
