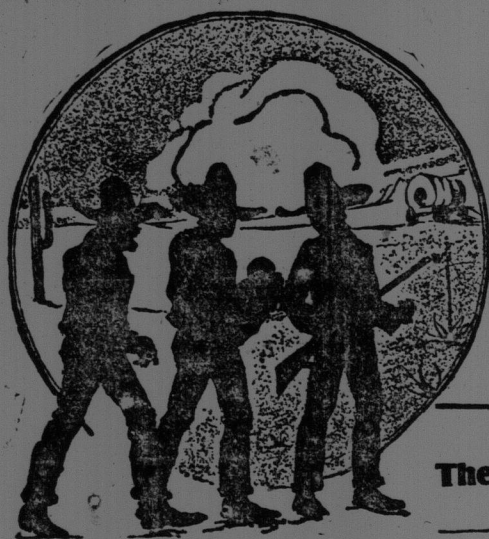

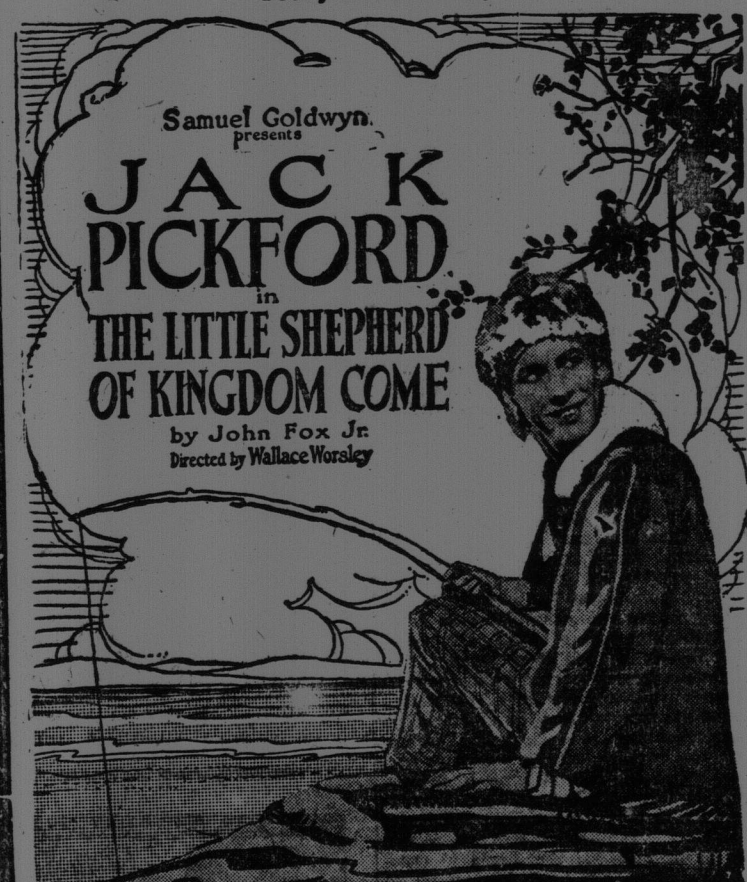

Says Grob Not to Be Traded.
Cincinnati, Dec. 24.—Upon his return after the baseball meeting in New York, August Herrmann, president of the Cincinnati Baseball Club, said that under no circumstances would the club trade either Heinie Grob or Eddie Roush. He admitted, however, that the New York club had offered \$150,000 for Grob. He also said that the Cincinnati club had not given up hope of landing Alcantara, Boston shortstop.

Toronto, Dec. 24.—The executive of the Ontario Hockey Association, pursuant to the policy adopted at the annual meeting of the association to eliminate the "mockey tourist," held prolonged sessions here yesterday and today in his effort to enforce the agreement arrived at during the recent annual meeting of A. A. U. of Canada in Winnipeg in regard to the placing of the hockey situation in all provincial organizations on a clean amateur basis, and that the O. H. A. is prepared to accept the decision of the C. A. H. A. president, if he thinks it advisable to call a special meeting of his executive, but suggests that a mail vote would accomplish the same purpose.

Chicago, Dec. 24.—Tex Rickard, New

York promoter, says he did not lose

money after all on the Dempsey-Brennan

card. He paid Dempsey \$100,000,

Brennan \$25,000, not \$35,000, and fuel

it was decided "that in view of the new

preliminaries only \$4,000, or \$129,000 for

the boxes. Overhead and incidentals

brought the cost to about \$139,000. Re-
