

STILL BELIEVES IN UNION GOVERNMENT

Winnipeg, Jan. 21.—Hon. Arthur Meighen, in a speech before the Canadian Club here today, outlined the Union government's programme of reconstruction. A large attendance of prominent Winnipeg citizens attended the luncheon and heard the address of the minister of the interior.

"I believed in Union government a year ago—I believe in it today. Granted faithful co-operation within the cabinet and a fair attitude without it means, I think, the best results to Canada. Believing that, my duty is unparaphrasing service as a minister of that government, wholehearted loyalty to its every member and continued fidelity to its chief, whom I have learned through so many years to honor. That duty I intend to discharge."

Reference was made to the recent appointment of the provincial superintendent of immigration. The secretary was instructed to forward a copy of these resolutions to the premier of the province.

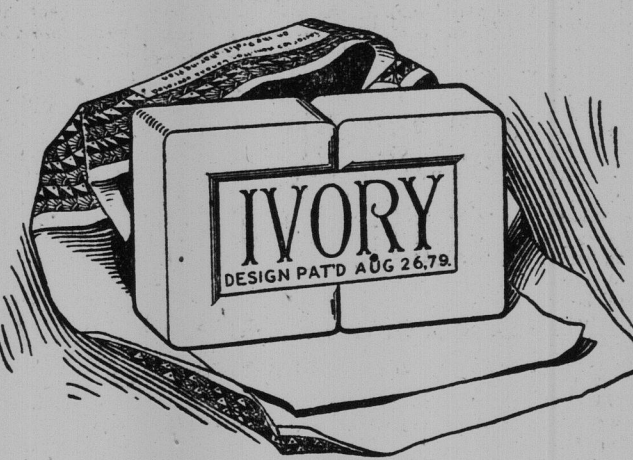

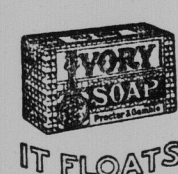

Mincola, N. Y., Jan. 21.—The Nassau county grand jury failed today to indict Mrs. Marie Augustine Lebaudy, who shot and killed her millionaire husband, the eccentric Jacques Lebaudy, at their home in Westbury early this month.

In her room at the jail Mrs. Lebaudy threw her hands above her head and cried out in French, "Thank God, thank God," when her attorney informed her that she had been freed of the charge of murder.

She broke down completely, the circumstances of a day of nervous tension, while awaiting the expected action of the grand jury, having sapped her strength, and it was necessary for the family nurse, who had been attending the prisoner, to put her to bed.

Dr. Irigoyen was elected president of the Argentine Republic in 1916 as the candidate of the radical party.

Is Germany to Get Back Her Atlantic Cables?

Paris, Jan. 21.—Are the German transatlantic cables to be given back to Germany? The Matin asks this question in today's issue. It points out that the two cables were cut four hours after Great Britain's declaration of war by a British cruiser close to Fayal, in the Azores. The cables became prizes of war, Great Britain taking one and France the other. Great Britain used hers in connection with her own cable lines to Canada, while France made no use of the line which she was allotted.

Franklin Roosevelt Says Most of Them Will Be Home By February 15—Sent Back Rapidly as Possible.

London, Jan. 21.—Franklin D. Roosevelt, under-secretary of the navy, after a conference with Admiral Sims on plans for demobilization of the American navy in European waters, said tonight that he was confident that with the exception of about 8,000 men, the American navy would be out of Europe no later than Feb. 15.

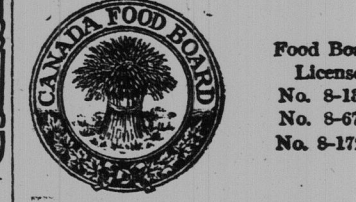
